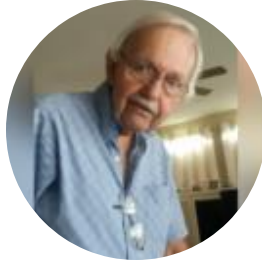

Robert proudly served our country in the United States Army and was an active member of the American Legion Post 760. In his free time, he enjoyed fishing and woodworking.

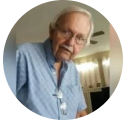
