



Henry Hindman

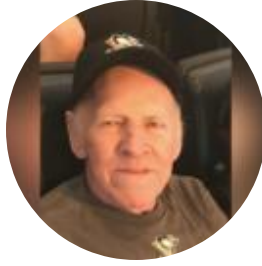
