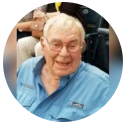
Richard J. (Dick) Hostert, Sr.

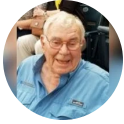

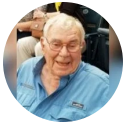
