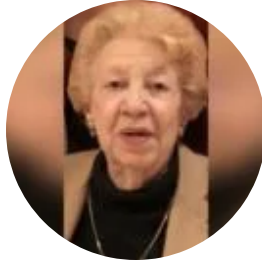

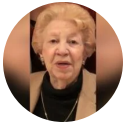
She was preceded in death by her husband of 63 years, A. Alfred Carolla; and her parents, Joseph and Emma Clairmont.
