They did many things throughout their marriage but their greatest corroboration was born July 13, 1975 - their daughter, Caroline. She has always made them proud. Caroline and her husband, Paul Stahlschmidt, live in Boone, NC surrounded by mountains and Mother Nature. John was preceded in death by his parents, John H. and Millie (Guthoerl) Staab as well as his youngest sister, Jean Krause, who passed away two months ago.
