Michael Anthony 'Mike' Mac, Jr., age 83, of Pittsburgh, passed away on November 17, 2025.

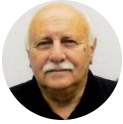

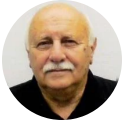
